A message from our Board Chair and Executive Director

2019 was another year of significant change and growth. Building on work from 2018, we continued to improve processes and upgrade systems, and we looked inward for every opportunity to improve how we serve our community.

The stronger your Foundation, the better we are able to honour the generosity of our donors and support Guelph's charitable and nonprofit organizations. Significant changes this year included:

- Moving to new, fully accessible shared office space with PIN—sharing resources and expenses;
- Selecting RBC Dominion Securities as our new investment advisor after an extensive request for proposal process;
- Investing in a single, integrated grants and financial system for greater security, efficiency and reporting;
- Updating policies and bylaws to ensure strong governance and streamlined administration;
- Reinvigorating and balancing our Board of Directors, Granting, Investment, Asset Development and Professional Advisor Committees with a range of life experiences and skill sets.

As we write this letter, our community is reeling from a global pandemic, an economic downturn, ongoing drug and mental health crises and a societal awakening to systemic racism and deeply

ingrained social injustice. Because of the changes we've made in the past year, your Foundation has been better able to react and respond by working efficiently alongside our community partners to raise and grant funds at an unprecedented rate.

This was possible because of our incredible staff and volunteers. Your Foundation depends on the leadership and guidance provided by our Board and Committee members and our 48 dedicated volunteers. Thank you for your commitment and support this year.

Early in 2019, we officially bid farewell to outgoing board members Susan Brown and Jay Elinesky, both had served for many years on the Board. We thank them for their vision and influence over the years.

These are difficult times and with your support we are up to the challenges ahead. We are working closely with charities, our committees and new investment advisors to prepare and be ready for what's to come knowing that our community needs are urgent and growing.

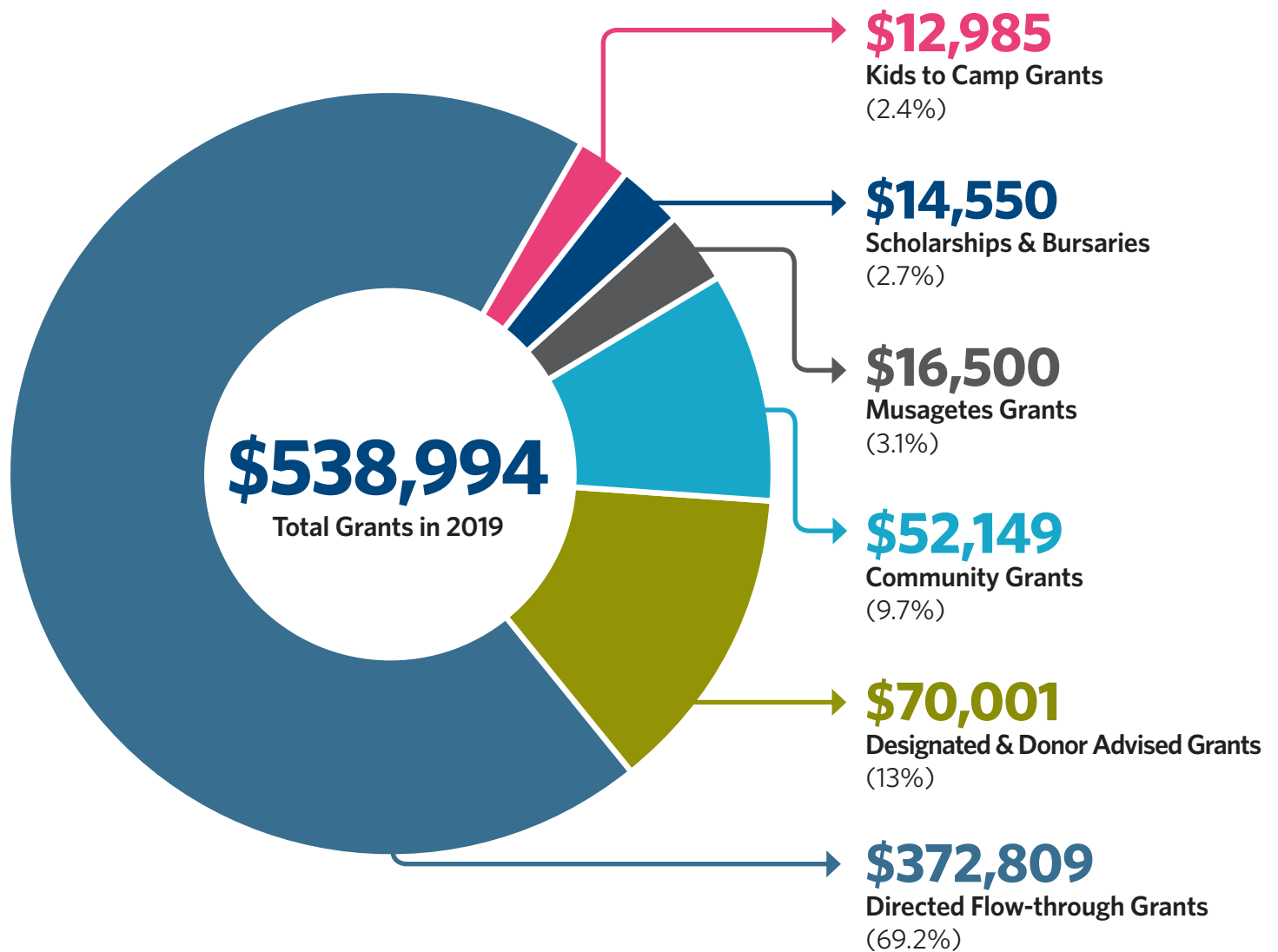

The Julien Project Healing Silent Wounds

Vital Signs Category - Community Vitality
Supported by: 2019 Community Grants

The Julien Project is a charitable organization that provides social and therapeutic gardening opportunities for people of diverse backgrounds and abilities enabling personal growth, community membership, and environmental well-being. Over the last 13 years, The Julien Project has delivered therapeutic horticulture and urban agricultural skill development programs and workshops for local marginalized populations. These include sessions for adults from the mental health community and students from special needs school programs. This 2019 community grant supported their "Healing Silent Wounds" program and increased the number of weekly programs delivered to local refugee families. The program reduces the stigma of mental illness especially for trauma survivors and supports youth who are refugee camp survivors. The Healing Silent Wounds program provided 18 weekly therapeutic and urban agriculture skill development workshops for local immigrants coping with trauma.

Wyndham House

Youth Transportation Support
Vital Signs Category - Health/No Poverty
Supported by: Tai Yu Fund

At Wyndham House, they understand housing means far more than a roof overhead or a place to eat. They create safe spaces where youth are empowered to develop skills, make impactful decisions, contribute to their community, forge their identity and ultimately reach their full potential. Through their 16-bed housing space, they offer youth access to basic needs, aimed at providing a stable, supportive, longer-term housing option so they can focus their attention on working towards their educational goals. This grant ensured youth have barrier-free access to the transportation supports they need to get to medical and counselling appointments, job interviews, apartment viewings and to attend high school classes and recreational activities. All of these are critical for youth so they can move their lives forward. All youth they serve are currently living in poverty and are unable to purchase bus tickets — this grant supported 350-400 bus tickets needed each month.

Reducing Food Insecurity for New Canadians

Vital Signs Category - Health/Zero Hunger

Supported by: Mildred Christie Fund and 2019 Community Grants

With feedback from volunteers, Chalmers recognized that newcomers to Canada are seeking different kinds of food than what they have offered up until now. They sought out academic research in partnership with the University of Guelph and the Guelph Wellington Poverty Task Force, as well as conducted surveys of guests to ask what foods they would prefer. With feedback from newcomer and refugee communities from Eritrea, Nepal, Iran, Afghanistan and various Arabic speaking countries, this grant provided the resources to purchase a more diverse selection of local foods that matched the unique cultural communities they serve.

Financial summary

Prepared for tomorrow

After an extensive request for proposal process, in September 2019 our Board of Directors supported a recommendation by our Investment and Finance Committee to select Clayson Wealth Management at RBC Dominion Securities as our investment advisor. Based in Guelph, Ed Clayson and team provide us with in-depth research, discretionary portfolio management and the capacity to monitor our investments in real time. The portfolio transferred during 2019 with year end investment returns of 9.05%.

With this change, your Foundation has laid the groundwork for proactively managing our investment returns to fulfill our vision, mission and community values. Our Investment and Finance Committee continue to work closely with the Clayson Wealth Management Team to ensure we are prepared and supported as we plan for the future and respond to community needs.

At the end of 2019, your Foundation managed \$13.5 million in funds — funds that will continue to grow over the years, leaving a lasting legacy for future generations.
